Notes from the summer break:

FEZZY BEAR is now available in an 18" model and retails for \$49.99.

It is back to school time and there is great concern for the way our children wear their backpacks; the pack should be no wider than the user's chest, worn no lower than 2-4 inches below the waist, made of lightweight material, worn no higher than the base of the neck and, supported by a waist and chest strap. A good BACKPACK has a padded back, several compartments, side compression straps, waist and chest straps, reflectors and well padded shoulder straps. A young Ukrainian boy burnt at 3 years of age over 30 percent of his body is abandoned by his mother at 11 years old. He is unable to walk, one arm is fused to his chest. He was brought to the Boston Burn Unit. He now walks, talks and says, "I can do everything now...I can live a life."

First Lady, Cheryl Strauss has revealed her fundraising program in support of the transportation fund, "The Journey of Hope". A\$40 donation contributor will receive a bracelet and a \$30 donation will receive a gentleman's tie.

Also new this year is the "Walk for Love" program. It is a similar program to the Terry Fox Run.
