### Remembrance Day

November 11th is the day dedicated to fallen heroes, veterans of all wars, military parades, verses of <u>In Flanders Fields</u> resonating in school hallways and <u>The Last Post</u> being played at cenotaph services throughout our nation.

To give some perspective to the number of casualties incurred by our fighting men and women, think of these sacrifices: WW I - 59,544; WW II - 44,895; Korean War - 516; Afghanistan - 151 and our Peacekeeping Corps - 112 and counting. Add to these numbers the conflicts in south Africa, Hong Kong, Bosnia, the Merchant Marine and our First Nations units!

When in Ottawa, it is worth a visit to the Peace Tower mezzanine in the centre block of the Parliament Buildings to view the *Great Book of Remembrance* which records the names of all who died for our freedom and which includes this passage:

"They are too near to be great; but children will understand, What and how our fate was changed, and by whose hand."

Do we have a real connection to Remembrance Day? Do we wear a poppy (made the universal symbol of remembrance in 1920) without really knowing or understanding or appreciating its meaning?

We owe a great deal to our armed forces. Let us remember the members of our lodges who have given their lives during global conflicts. Let us do more than just remember them on Remembrance Day, which could be considered as a second Thanksgiving Day. Let us have the courage and humility to offer a sincere "Thank You" to them before it becomes too late to do so.
